

MMS – Findings from Migrant Engagement

- Councils do have an important role to play, first port of call/ contact inevitable
- Third sector also has a role (building trust, providing support, interpreting culture)
- Many migrants are not clear about the limits of local authorities powers/ responsibilities
- Migrants have many of the same issues as the local population but often feel that difficulties are encountered because of their status as a migrant (expectation management/ educating service providers & front line staff)
- Integration is a two way process





MMS – Future Progression

- MMS was devised as a pilot study
 We hope that its completion has:
- Contributed to the evidence base on migration for local authorities
- Provided local authorities with tools & information to continue development of their work with their migrant communities
- Provided a platform for potential collaboration in the future
